

UHI Psychology Degree: Important Information (One copy for student, one for interviewer)

Course delivery format	The course is delivered through a blended format: learning resources are delivered primarily online. Online materials are supported by synchronous virtual classrooms. You should note that some assessments will require attendance and there are two points of mandatory attendance during the academic year.
Learning responsibility	<p>Students should have easy access to a learning centre and/or have a computer which meets the minimum requirements. Additional tutorials and seminars are offered on a regular basis via the virtual classroom in Brightspace.</p> <p>Students are responsible for ensuring they have enough time to study and that they are available to sit exams when required. We strongly recommend that full time students should not be working for more than 12 hours per week in external employment.</p> <p>Students studying full-time will complete 6 modules over each academic year. Three modules will be completed each semester. Modules for each semester run concurrently. Full-time students should expect to study for 40 hours per week.</p> <p>Students studying part-time will complete 3 modules per academic year, so will study 2 modules in one semester and 1 module in the other semester. Part time structured students should expect to study for approximately 20 hours per week.</p>
Face to face Induction	<p>There is a face to face Induction where attendance is Mandatory. This will take place at UHI Inverness at a weekend in late August/early September 2023. Students must be able to attend the 2 day induction in 1st year and 3rd year. Students applying for direct entrance to second year must also attend this. This is a BPS requirement and cannot be waived.</p> <p>Students will also attend a local college registration event in each year of study. This is likely to be a half day event in the week prior to the start of Semester 1.</p> <p>Students are responsible for the full costs of their travel to and from the Induction and for their accommodation, living costs and travel during this period.</p>
Residential	<p>The annual Residential is held in Inverness.</p> <p>For students studying full-time, attendance is mandatory in each year of the course. The Residential will run over four days prior to the Easter holiday each year. Part time students will attend every other year. All students must attend 4 residentials over the course of the degree. This is a BPS requirement and cannot be waived.</p> <p>Students are responsible for; the full cost of their travel to and from the Induction and Residential, their accommodation, living costs and travel during these periods.</p>
BPS	<p>The course is accredited by the British Psychological Society. In order to graduate with a BPS accredited qualification students must attend the Residential and the Induction (direct entrants must also attend).</p> <p>Students must undertake a psychology dissertation, supervised by a psychologist.</p> <p>To be eligible for BPS membership following completion of the degree, the final classification must be a 2:2 or above.</p> <p>Students may also choose to exit with a BSc Psychological Studies if any of these conditions are not met.</p>
RPL	<p>Students with previous degree level study can apply for credit for this to enable direct entrance to subsequent year or partial credit for year of entry. Students must provide academic transcripts (translated if necessary) and must apply for Recognised Previous Learning (RPL).</p> <p>Any offer made is conditional upon successful RPL, which will be determined by the RPL board.</p>
Residency	Students are expected to be registered as permanently resident in Scotland from the 1st August of the year they enrol and for the duration their degree study.
